Oregon Mentors will be delivering a six-hour training based on the SAFE: Screening Applicants for Effectiveness curriculum. The training is a research-based approach to volunteer screening, offering an in-depth dive on 21 tools youth programs can be using to screen out potential child predators. The training will be offered in nine communities throughout the upcoming school year. Choose the date/location that works best for you. Tentative dates are:
