



Cyber Disruption Plan Workgroup Charter

Charter Authority	The Cyber Disruption Plan (CDP) Workgroup is responsible for developing, reviewing, and recommending updates to the Oregon Cyber Disruption Response and Recovery Plan.
Mission and Purpose	Oregon has established an Oregon “Whole of Government Community” Cyber Disruption Response and Recovery Plan (OCDRP). This plan brings the governing entities within Oregon together for an inclusive cybersecurity ecosystem. The Whole Community collaboration provides the greatest defense, response and rapid recovery against cyber disruption. The Mission of the Cyber Disruption Plan Workgroup is to provide recommendations to the Oregon Cyber Disruption Response and Recovery Plan and provide education, tools, and templates to mature cyber response in Oregon.
Members, Roles	Members will include a mix of cross governmental organizations. Members will support an inclusive cyber ecosystem. The chair of the CDP will be a local government member and will serve a 1 year term.
Scope	The CDP Workgroup will meet quarterly to share cyber threat information and situational awareness, as well present cyber education, identify cyber gaps and means to remediate, and network with other cyber professionals. The CDP Workgroup will recommend updates to the Oregon Cyber Disruption Response and Recovery Plan annually.
Guiding Principles	Principles to guide the content of our work: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Members act as a representative for their government organization.• Attend and participate actively in meetings to provide continuity to the discussions.• Encourage input from other members.• Actively build trust and promote collaboration in support of a whole of government cyber community.• Identify, develop and support ongoing education and training opportunities through collaborative research projects, community participation in formal and informal training opportunities, and peer-to-peer presentations and information sharing.
Decision Making	Workgroup will provide Cyber Disruption Response and Recovery Plan change recommendations to Cyber Security Services annually.
Measures of success	Increased cyber disruption coordination Increased situational awareness information sharing Increase cross governmental awareness of resources, tools, and capabilities
Meeting schedule	Meetings will be held quarterly (January, April, July, October) with a day/time routine as approved by the membership. Meeting may be held in person or remotely.
