The <u>Down Payment Assistance (DPA)</u> program offers forgivable loans to cover down payment and eligible closing costs on certain new homes, including houses, townhomes, condos, or manufactured homes. This unique program is for first-time homebuyers who want to buy a new home in Clackamas, Douglas, Jackson, Klamath, Lane, Lincoln, Linn, or Marion County.

Not ready to buy? Even if homeownership is not your next step, help is available. The <u>Intermediate Housing Assistance</u> (IHA) program provides temporary rental and utility assistance to help renters transition to a permanent home.

Get help navigating financial or housing challenges. ReOregon's <u>Housing Counseling Services (HCS)</u> can connect you with housing counselors to get personalized support to help meet your housing goals. Services may include budgeting, eviction prevention, legal aid, and more.

Interested? Apply now. If you think Housing Support Services might be right for you, start by reviewing the <u>required documentation</u>.

Once you have all the required documents, you will need to submit a <u>Housing Support Services</u> <u>application</u> to the <u>community action agency (CAA)</u> closest to you. This single application covers all three programs.
