



Looking Glass Riverfront School and Career Center Job Training Program Fact Sheet

Program: The Job Training Program prepares youth for success in the workforce by addressing work expectations, promoting higher education, and providing on-the-job skills training.

Our goal is to link academic and occupational learning throughout each youth's program involvement. Youth complete testing and evaluation in basic academic skills, career interests and employment aptitudes. This long-term program supports youth through the transition to adulthood.

Services are provided in collaboration with other community organizations, school districts and employers to better serve each youth.

Services:

- Alternative high school/ GED Preparation
- Tutoring
- Occupational skills training
- Leadership development
- Adult mentoring
- Paid work experiences and internships
- Mental health and substance abuse counseling referrals
- Support Services including: bus passes, identification documents, mentoring and tutoring services, occupational testing, and job search clothing
- Summer program opportunities linked to academic and occupational learning
- Follow-up services upon program completion
- Financial literacy training

Eligibility: Youth ages 14 – 24, low-income, out-of-school, in-school, facing barriers to employment
