

Indoor Clean Air Act Celebrating 10 Years


Oregon's bar and restaurant industry continues to grow

According to economic analyses, smokefree policies do not harm businesses, including bars and restaurants.¹ Since the ICAA expanded to include restaurants and bars in 2007, their numbers have grown. The number of establishments that serve food has increased.² Moreover, the number of businesses that sell alcohol has increased by a third since 2007, and the number of brewpubs has more than tripled.³


