



# Statewide Sexual Assault Law Enforcement and Prosecutor Training Project



This training aims to increase the capacity of the Criminal Justice System to effectively and empathetically respond to, investigate and prosecute sexual violence crimes. The training's materials and presentations, delivered through a trauma-informed lens, will focus on improving our understanding and handling of sexual violence crimes and their impact on victims and survivors. This is a cross-training event created for both Law Enforcement and Prosecutors. CEUs & MCLEs will be offered.

This two and a half day training will equip participants to implement new and emerging techniques and best practices in sexual assault investigation and prosecution. Following the training, participants will have access to ongoing technical assistance.

**Topics Include:** Sexual Assault Investigation, Response & Prosecution, Sexual Assault Dynamics, Trauma-Informed Interviewing Techniques, Report Writing, Overcoming the Consent Defense, Medical Forensic Exam, Motions and Expert Witnesses, Self-Care Skill Building.
