Ms. Pilkey is a Senior Nurse Consultant at the Maternal and Child Health Bureau/Health Resources and Services Administration and the federal project officer for the National Center for Fatality Review and Prevention cooperative agreement. Ms. Pilkey has more than 20 years of experience in public health at the local, state, and federal level, including with the Washington State Department of Health, where she worked as an epidemiologist and the Child Death Review Assessment Coordinator. Ms. Pilkey is a registered nurse who has practiced in both clinical and public health settings in both urban and rural contexts. Her work has focused on children and adolescents, injury and violence, infant mortality, and early childhood. Ms. Pilkey has a master's in public health from the Maternal and Child Health program at the University of

Washington Public Health School, a bachelor's in nursing from the University of North Carolina, and a bachelor's in Cultural Anthropology from Duke University.

Ms. Dykstra is a Senior Data Analyst with the National Center for Fatality Review and Prevention at MPH. Since joining the National Center in 2006, Ms. Dykstra has been a key consultant for states to better understand and make more effective use of the data collected with the web-based National Fatality Review Case Reporting System (NFR-CRS). Ms. Dykstra assists with the management of NFR-CRS software releases (including developing reporting requirements, testing system functionality, and revising system documentation) and provides training to new users. Ms. Dykstra has also coordinated with several other federal agencies on different data projects related to the NFR-CRS.
