What is the Strategic Storytelling Project? A cohort of 4 -6 Fatality Review teams and storytelling experts in a hybrid Action Learning Collaborative, exploring the power of stories to support infant health outcomes.

- Stories to complement current data collection
- Plan for integrating stories/storytelling into fatality review

## How will the Action Learning Collaborative operate?

- 1:1 coaching sessions in between
