April Quarterly OGIC Meeting Recap

The OGIC meeting held April 24, 2024, was a 100% virtual meeting due to a shorter than usual agenda. However, there were two key actions that are highlighted below.

The meeting packet and recording are also available online.

Oregon Recreation Data Standard

The Oregon Recreation Data Standard specifies a common model for representing recreation area, site, and facility information needed by numerous entities working to support and provide recreation data for management, planning, and public consumption. Standardization of recreation data will help to overcome integration and data sharing hurdles and lead to better outcomes for equitable recreation planning, resource management, health tracking and emergency response.

The development of data standards follows the process outlined in the <u>Oregon</u> <u>Geospatial Standards Development</u> <u>Guidelines</u>. The process includes the formation of a workgroup to draft the standard, presentation of the draft standard at a Framework Program Forum, a public review and comment period, and review by the OGIC Technical Advisory Committee. Once complete the final draft is presented to OGIC for endorsement.

Brady Callahan with the Oregon Parks and Recreation Dept. presented the standard to OGIC April 24th where OGIC then voted to endorse the new data standard.

New OGIC Hub Launched

Framework Data Development Grant Program Project Awards

OGIC awards funds biennially through the Framework Data Development Grant Program for projects that develop, define, enhance, update, or integrate geospatial framework data. Project proposals were scored based on their alignment with the Framework Program mission and goals, the Governors' priorities (housing and homelessness, behavior health, education and early

learning), and OGIC priorities (filling data gaps, improving accuracy, or increasing update frequency). At the April 2024 OGIC meeting nearly \$70K was awarded for the following projects:

- 2025 Zoning Layer Updates submitted by the Oregon Department of Land Conservation and Development (DLCD)
- Urban Growth Boundaries: Corrections, Updates, and Improvements - submitted by DLCD
- Statewide Historic Vegetation Update submitted by the Institute for Natural Resources, Portland State University

The projects are expected to kick-off in the summer of 2024. Upon completion, the updated data will be available to the public on <u>GEOHub</u>. The next opportunity for organizations to submit a proposal for the Framework Data Development Grant Program will be in the spring of 2025 for projects in the 2025-27 biennium.
