NWS

- Still looking pretty mild
- Next system coming in Thurs 2/18 is predominantly rain, with snow accumulations in the Cascades
- Temps will remain mild, with Sunday being in the low 50s
- Little to no wind impacts for inland and coastal
- Southern portion of state will see more rain than the northern part of the state

- Email sent out earlier today regarding IDA information, need back by Thursday 2/25 COB
- If meet the minimal criteria will request a joint PDA from RX

County Reports

Benton County - Bryan Young

- Activated for vaccine support about 600 people without power
- Some Pac Power crews are staged to help out
- Working on debris removal and damage assessments

<u>Clackamas County – Daniel Nibouar</u>

- Still working on debris issues
- Lots of residents vulnerable or with small children, so trying to get into congregate shelters
- County has approved limited hotel lodging
- Have 3 charging centers

Marion County - Kathleen Silva

- EOC open 8-5 through the weekend
- Have virtual Adobe, contact Kathleen for access ksilva@co.marion.or.us
- Mt Angel: Power restored, Verizon restored
- Turner: Partial power, widespread impacts
- Silverton: still working on the generator issue and YMCA is providing showers

- Brooks: Partial Power, some community members had septic backed up into homes due to no power
- Fairgrounds: Received power yesterday
- Debris Management: PGE has closed road to North Marion Transfer Station until tomorrow night
- Aumsville: lost power so warming station closed today at 11 am
- Salem: 28 traffic lights out as of 4 p.m. 2/16, debris drop sites established
- Gervais: No power, need communication assistance for law enforcement and fire possible community if available would like assist from county to open warming/charging stations.
- Woodburn: CERT activated for documenting damage assessment for the city, warming center opened at a Love-Inc site
- Santiam Water Control: still assessing damage but it appears the majority of our 114 miles of canals are impacted with large wood debris. Majority of the system carries irrigation water.
- Aurora: Sewer operator reports their borrowed generator failed (on their lift station). The failed generator is a 440V, 3ph, 50-75kW.
- Mill City: internet back up and running

Polk County – Dean Bender

- EOC Virtually
- Declared today (2/17)
- Most sites still working on backup power
- Falls City: Continue to support water treatment with a generator for operation
- 3,600 people without power
- Crews out documenting damage and debris

- Dayton: Still without water
- Borrowed generator has just failed at lift station (possibly borrowed from Clackamas County?)
- Dayton has water and is able to supply city just fine. Just a couple wells down. Sewer lagoons are sans power, but staff is maintaining levels in shifts.
- Aurora stated their borrowed generator failed and the sewer operator didn't know who to reach out to. Forwarded the info to Kathleen Silva.

ESF-1 Transportation: Jessica Gorley

- All major highways are open
- Continue to work with utilities to help open roadways

ESF-2 Communications – DAS: William Chapman

- ATT: 30 sites outTMobile: 42 sites outVerizon: 18 sites out
- Vast majority of site restorations have been mainly due to power restoration. Some commercial
 power restoration, but many are still on generator power and will fluctuate if/when generators
 run out of fuel or fail.
- The remaining sites that are out of service are due to a failure of backhaul/transport and will likely remain OOS until fiber providers can restore connectivity to these sites. Fiber providers are prioritizing these sites for restoration, but dependent on power restoration before broadband can follow.
- 1 PSAP still on generator power, enough fuel for 3-4 days
- State Network Outage 13 sites still out of service.

- On-going coordination to establish restoration between utilities and other entities
- Interdependencies working well for communications
- OPUC at point where taking steps to collect data for estimates on restoration times, etc. to be distributed

ESF-6: Mass Care – DHS: Chad Knowles

- 1 outstanding request for Clackamas County, put on hold by county
- Connected 200 PGE linemen to a feeding operation which should continue through end of work
- Monitoring for clinically medically needs
- Feeding access a bit slow to outlying areas, but continuing to work on

Slight delay in PPE shipments, warehouse was down due to power and internet outage

Salem Hospital operations are improving, have above normal number of patients

- Patient transfers/discharges, increased census numbers, communications, power/fuel continue to be top issues for this response.
- All emergency departments open except OHSU, which is at capacity and is currently on divert
