

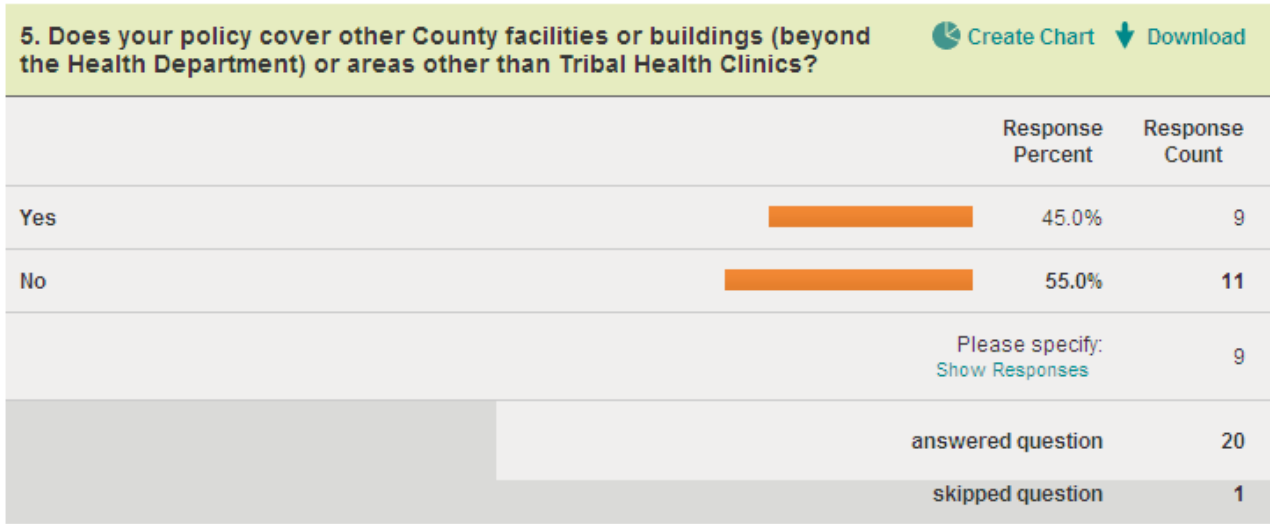

Tribal Housing

The smoke free policy encompasses tribal administration buildings.
