What's Smoking Got to Do with It? Improving the Health of Priority Populations by Treating Tobacco Use	UCSF Smoking Cessation Leadership Center	Smoking and tobacco health disparities disproportionately impact health priority populations evidenced in higher morbidity and mortality. Attending to other “major” or “primary” conditions without treating tobacco use can compromise long-term treatment effectiveness (e.g., drug therapies) or subject clients to greater problems related to untreated smoking.
