# Who inspects retailers? We wanted to clarify who conducts different inspections of retailers. There are a few agencies that conduct

inspections in retail stores: the US Food and Drug Administration (FDA), Oregon Department of Revenue (DOR), Oregon Health Authority (OHA), and—in some jurisdictions—local public health authorities. • Inspections to ensure compliance with federal tobacco sales laws and regulations, including not

- selling tobacco to people under 21, are conducted by the **FDA**. • Inspections to make sure retailers have their tobacco retail licenses and ensure compliance with
- Oregon tobacco tax laws are conducted by **DOR**. Minimum Legal Sales Age (MLSA) Inspections that check compliance with not selling tobacco to

people under 21 are conducted by undercover young adult inspectors, supervised by compliance


- specialists from **OHA** or the **local public health authority**. • Compliance inspections that check for compliance with state and federal tobacco sales laws are conducted by compliance specialists from **OHA** or the **local public health authority**. [Information




