

THE LONG ROAD TO HONOR

Several years ago a friend who is an excellent researcher and I learned that a local funeral home had hundreds of unclaimed cremated remains, known as cremains, stored in a non-public area. Some of the cremains dated back over one hundred years. Utilizing the free web site Findagrave.com we began to build memorials for each of these people so that they would not be forgotten. We searched genealogy sites attempting to find relatives for the deceased and we were successful for some of the deceased. We built an online memorial for every unclaimed cremains that included their life histories and the documents we could find.

The project took years. We identified individuals believed to be United States military veterans and dependents of those veterans. We just couldn't let these veterans remain unclaimed and we knew the Veterans Administration would provide burial benefits if we could document military service.

Our next step was locating the actual cremains in storage. That took much time and searching. Denise Hatch joined the team here. Some cremains were so old that the paper name labels had faded to the point we had difficulty identifying the deceased.

The next step was to research and document military service and submit a claim to the VA for interment at Willamette National Cemetery. For this step we called upon the military historians of the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War with whom we have worked on other projects.

We have been grateful for the help of many along the road to where we are today - the honorable dignified interment of United States military veterans and dependents.
