Have peace of mind with a shot at home every 2 months

Apretude (cabotegravir) is an FDA-approved medication for long-acting HIV pre-exposure prevention (PrEP). In studies, Apretude works better to prevent HIV than other PrEP options. A health care provider must give an Apretude shot every 2 months.

Help us find out if getting the shots from a nurse at home is a good way deliver Apretude and expand access to long-acting PrEP throughout Oregon.

Join the study!

You may be eligible if you:

- Are HIV-negative
- Age 18 or older
- Live in Oregon
- Are not pregnant
- Speak and read English or Spanish

What's involved?

The study lasts 13 months.

You will meet over video with a PrEP-expert clinician with the OHSU Tele-PrEP Program. If Apretude is right for you, you will be referred to the OHSU Home Infusion Pharmacy to receive doses in your home (or another clean, secure place that is appropriate for a home nurse visit).

The study team will ask you to complete 2 questionnaires about your experience during the study period. You will receive a \$30 debit card for each questionnaire completed.
