Description:

The Pregnancy Care and Access ECHO Program includes an opportunity to engage in a didactic presentation, gain insight on how I/T/U facilities may effectively integrate timely pregnancy care, and become part of a learning community. In this presentation, a panel of public health nurses describes public health nursing case management strategies used to support pregnant individuals at risk for STIs as well as how to implement community-based outreach strategies and employ interventions that support prevention of congenital STIs and improve maternal and infant health outcomes.

Outcomes/Objectives:

1. Apply public health nursing case management strategies used to identify, monitor, and support pregnant individuals at risk for STIs.
2. Implement community-based outreach strategies used by PHNs to engage pregnant individuals in STI education, testing, and treatment services.
3. Employ PHN interventions that support prevention of congenital STIs and improve maternal and infant health outcomes.
