Background

In August 2012, the Water Resources Commission adopted Oregon's first Integrated Water Resources Strategy. It contains more than 40 recommended actions, one of which is aimed at encouraging place-based approaches to integrated water resources planning. The state of Oregon is in the process of developing guidelines that can facilitate place-based planning efforts within Oregon communities, with the ultimate goal of meeting current and future water needs – instream and out-of-stream, including water quantity, water quality, and ecosystem needs.

Release of Discussion Paper & Draft Guidelines

The Oregon Water Resources Department has released a Discussion Paper that examines regional or local water planning approaches from three western states – California's Integrated Regional Water Management, Texas' Regional Water Planning Program, and Washington's Watershed Planning process. The purpose of this paper is to highlight several key planning elements that could inform Oregon's approach to place-based, integrated water resources planning. Several questions are posed throughout the paper, and serve as a starting point for discussion with stakeholders and the public.
