Librarian: The City of Cornelius is excited to announce our recruitment for a full-time Adult Services Librarian to join the growing staff in the newly constructed Cornelius Public Library. This position performs a range of professional library services, including reference and readers' advisory, collection development, community outreach and the development and implementation of programming— with an emphasis on adults and seniors. Additional duties include participation on the management team and supervision of a department and staff.

Mandatory Requirements: Knowledge of the principles, practices and philosophy of public library operations, current methods and principles governing reference services, and collection management of print and non-print materials. Completion of an ALA accredited Master's of Library Science program, and four years of increasingly responsible experience in a library, including one year of leadership, or any satisfactory combination of experience and training which demonstrates the knowledge, skills and abilities to perform the above duties. Fluency in Spanish language desirable.
