• June is (2S) LGBTQ+ Pride Month

- o <u>International LGBTQ+ Pride Day</u> is observed on June 28, commemorating the Stonewall Riots happening on this day in 1969.
- June is <u>National Caribbean American Heritage Month</u>, a time to recognize, honor and celebrate the history, diverse culture and significant contributions of the Caribbean American population.
- June is **National Immigrant Heritage Month**, aiming to recognize and celebrate the contributions and diverse cultures of immigrants.
- <u>Juneteenth</u>, also known as *Freedom Day*, is observed on June 19. This day observes the day, nearly two years after President Lincoln's 1983 Emancipation Proclamation, when Union soldiers arrived in Galveston, Texans on June 19, 1865, delivering the news that slavery was abolished.
