### (Podcast) OVERDUE: Weeding Out Oppression in Libraries (OLA EDI & Antiracism

Committee; a new episode will launch on **Monday, June 30**<sup>th</sup>) A podcast attempting to shine light on the radical inequities and the oppressive nature of the library profession, specifically as it pertains to BIPOC professionals and the communities they serve in the state of Oregon.



- The Continental Congress's adoption of the Declaration of independence marked the official birth of the United States. Whether or not you celebrate, reflect on what freedom looks like and means to you, and take time to <u>consider what racial</u> <u>implications of the 4<sup>th</sup> of July</u> might exist surrounding this holiday.
- Since 2012, International Non-Binary People's Day happens annually on July 14<sup>th</sup>. This day is meant to raise awareness, celebrate and uplift people who do not identify within the traditional gender binary.
- The United Nations' honors **July 18**<sup>th</sup> as <u>Nelson Mandela International Day</u>. This global celebration, falling annually on Mandela's birthday, is meant to honor the life, legacy and accomplishments of Nelson Madela, and is meant to inspire individuals to make a difference in their communities.
