OLA Technology Vision

- Penny Hummel discussed some discussion topics:
Where should/nt OLA be going technology wise?
 - Software/purchases/technology audits...
 - Plan for moving ahead
 - OLA Website (ACRL model?) Front-end work. A new model for the user interface might incorporate something like Wordpress, but Memberclicks would still be part of the site. How might this look?
 - Oregon State Library's plans for Plinkit were discussed, as were the options for libraries dependent on Plinkit. Darci, in her role at the OSL, reported on some of their transitioning ideas, and reported that the OSL is playing a very supportive role for these libraries and developing alternatives.

As far as having a table at the conference, we might want to see if we could split a table with Tech Services, and just have some informational material out. There is not a lot of interest from the group about hosting a technology petting zoo like what was done last year—though it was a good idea. Will follow up with TSRT about a table split—Heather mentioned that as past chair, she was able to bring that idea up with them.

Other news

Brent has been working on the Wiki, we still have our Blog in place, but not much action has happened there. We should be thinking about ways to promote these online resources.

Picking a project: The group expressed interest in getting a survey of libraries together—what kind of technology are the libraries in Oregon using? If

we had an idea, we could set up a listing on our site, so people could find out who was using what, to draw on the experience and expertise of other libraries when trying a new software package, for example.

MOOC panel, by mid-January, we should have a line-up of speakers together.
