Children's Advocacy Center of Jackson County Child Abuse and Neglect Symposium 2014

This year's symposium will focus on the epidemic of child sex trafficking and exploitation. Our speakers will discuss a multidisciplinary approach to identifying current and potential victims and provide tools to help reach these victims, who are oftentimes uniquely difficult to reach.

An emphasis will be on potential front line individuals who are key in identifying children who are at risk for trafficking or who may already be victims. Investigation and system response will be addressed followed by a rare "insider's view" of how children are victimized from a perpetrators perspective.

The day will conclude with casestudies and discussions to help integrate the tools presented.

Speakers

Sergeant Byron Fassett has been with the Dallas Police Department for 32 years. He has served 20 of those years in the Child Exploitation Squad which he now supervises, handles approximately 1100 cases a year, and is divided into three teams, The Investigations Team, the High Risk Victims and Trafficking Team (HRVT), and the Internet Crimes Against Children Team (ICAC). Sgt. Fassett started the Sex Offender Apprehension Program in Dallas Texas. This program has now been replicated in several other agencies. He presents both nationally and internationally on Domestic Trafficking of Children, and is involved in the planning and development of the Annual Crimes Against Children Conference in Dallas Texas.

Detective Cathy De La Paz is a 28 year veteran of the Dallas Police Department, assigned to the High Risk Victims and Trafficking Unit within the Child Exploitation Squad for the last 12 vears. As a detective on the HRVT unit, she specializes in investigations involving sexual abuse and exploitation of High Risk Victims, such as chronic runaways and children who have been victims of sexual abuse. She has worked over 2,000 cases involving sexually exploited children and has interviewed hundreds of victims and suspects. These cases often involve children who are avoidant and reluctant to make disclosures of their abuse. Det. De La Paz specializes in conducting interviews with adolescents in this situation, and is often called upon to assist and consult on interviews and cases locally and internationally.
