Kelly Decker, Ph.D., is a clinical psychologist at the National Center for Child Traumatic Stress at the University of California, Los Angeles. The National Center is the coordinating agency for over 75 sites nationwide dedicated to improving access and increasing the standard of care for traumatized children and families. For the past ten years, Dr. Decker has trained on the impact of traumatic stress on youth, families and professionals across the juvenile justice, child welfare, and mental health service systems. She specializes in evidencebased treatment of children, adults, and families, and her research interested include understanding the developmental consequences of childhood trauma and maltreatment with respect to mental illness, suicide and self-injury. Currently, she is serving as a member of the NCJFCJ Juvenile Drug Court Treatment Task Force and consultant on their trauma audit pilot program for juvenile and family courts.



In 2006 David Pittman took the first step in acknowledging the childhood sexual abuse that was perpetrated against him from the ages of I2 to I5. His recovery process led him to write a blog called Together We Heal. His blog received an overwhelming response from readers. Together We Heal morphed into an official non-profit which grew to include a team of professionals dedicated to helping educate the public and to helping survivors recover from their abuse. TWH now has a real and substantial on-line presence and is leading through example within the South Florida community with a weekly support group in partnership with the Survivors Network of Those Abused by Priests (SNAP). It has extended relationships to include other leading national and international survivor support organizations, as well as local affiliations with groups such as the Victim Services Division of Palm Beach County. He is a member of the American Academy of Experts in Traumatic Stress and a leader of a support group for SNAP.
