With the release of the Version 4.0 Case Report Form in June 2015, the ability to record a category for SUID cases (question M8) became available to all states participating in child death review.

These categories allow local/state programs to track SUID subtypes, create a valuable tool to identify gaps in investigation, and inform SUID reduction strategies while not replacing official cause-of-death determinations.
