Dr. David Finkelhor

Dr. Finkelhor is the Director of the Crimes Against Children Research Center, Co-Director of the Family Research Laboratory, and Professor of Sociology at the Univ. of New Hampshire. He has been studying child victimization since 1977. He is the author and editor of 11 books and over 150 journal articles and book chapters. In 1994, he was given the Distinguished Child Abuse Professional Award by the US Dept. of Justice, and in 2004 he was given the Significant Achievement Award from the Association for the Treatment of Sexual Abusers.



Dr. Sharon Cooper

Dr. Cooper is the CEO of Developmental and Forensic Pediatrics, PA. She is a consultant to the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children and a member of the International Center for Missing and Exploited Children. She provides congressional testimonies on Internet crimes against children and serves on several national boards.



Jennifer Newman

Jennifer Newman is Senior Program Strategist for the National Center for Missing & Exploited. She joined NCMEC in 2001 and has spent the last 15 years fighting the sexual exploitation of children. She moved to Oregon in 2007. She has been a presenter on child victimization to law enforcement and other professionals for over a decade.



Teresa Huizar

Teresa Huizar is the Executive Director of the National Children's Alliance, which is the national accrediting body for Children's Advocacy Center. She presents nationally on topics related to child abuse prevalence, prevention, intervention, and treatment.



Colin Fagan

Colin Fagan is a Detective Sergeant in charge of the major case unit for the Jackson County Sheriff's Office and was the first president of the Oregon Homicide Investigators Association. He has worked extensively in online victimization of children.
