



Thirteenth Annual Childhood Grief and Traumatic Loss

"How can we best aid families recovering from a traumatic death or loss?"

This unique conference will be live streamed on the Internet and is titled "Children Who Survive Fatal Family Violence". Presentations and workshops will cover many topics. There is a need to understand survivors because of the complex issues involved and because we know so little about them. ICAN has 39 years of child fatality review experience and helped build 1,000 teams internationally. We are building a network to help people find programs, for child grief, trauma and loss.

Plenary presentations will include a panel of five experts who will address all ages but focus primarily on the young. Topics will include child witness to assault, finding the body, a child witness in court, funerals, grave visits, child and adult peer support, agencies working together, therapy vs therapeutic settings, and memorabilia.
