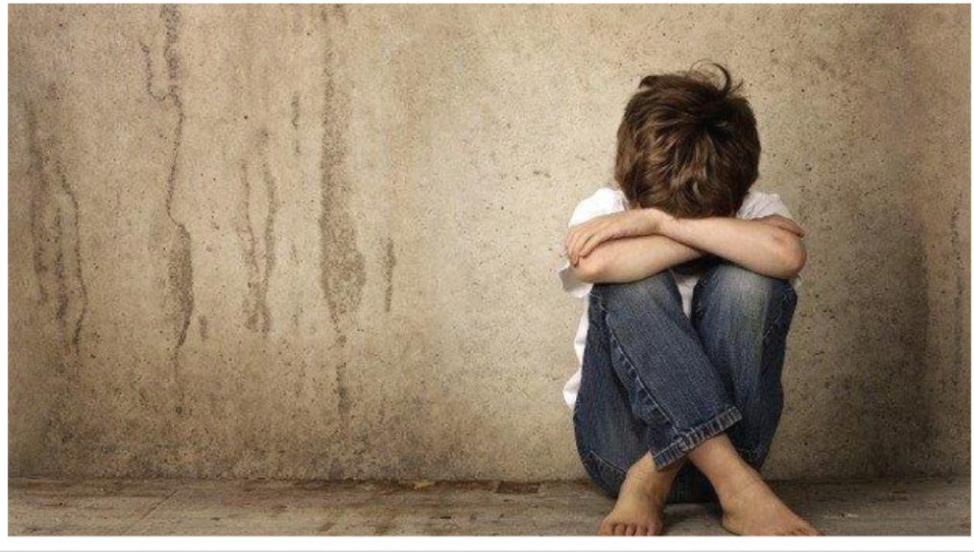

This presentation hopes to define what constitutes child torture and to provide investigators, medical and legal professionals and others with useful tools to manage the clinical complexities seen in torture cases. Parent child interaction therapy (PCIT) will be discussed as an evidenced based intervention in high risk families to reduce the incidence of child physical abuse.

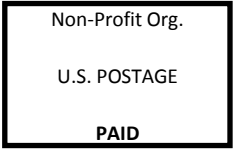
