OVERVIEW OF TRAINING

This training is a first-of-its-kind, statewide Pilot training for Oregon's multidisciplinary team members and fulfills statutorily mandated training requirements that include information on risk assessment, the dynamics of child abuse, child sexual abuse and rape of children and forensic interviewing.

This training has a focus on field response and is appropriate for all members of the multidisciplinary team. Participants may include law enforcement, child protective service workers, school officials, medical professionals, mental health treatment providers, Children's Advocacy Center employees, juvenile department representatives and others (ORS 418.747).



WHAT DOES THIS TRAINING COVER?

During this two day, live, virtual training, Oregon's forensic interviewing expert trainers will combine lectures, video content and group activities to help learners:

- Enhance their knowledge of child development, memory and trauma, disclosure dynamics and the Children's Advocacy Center (CAC) model in Oregon.
- Identify question types used when talking with children, learn strategies designed to reduce trauma and be more prepared to deploy questions in a legally sound, developmentally-appropriate and defensible manner.
- Understand professional roles and responsibilities and how to work together to provide collaborative child abuse response throughout the life of a case.
