OVERVIEW OF TRAINING

Collaborative Child Abuse Response (CCAR) is a statewide training pilot for Oregon's multidisciplinary team members and fulfills statutorily mandated training requirements. CCAR provides foundational information about child abuse assessment and will improve participants understanding of the MDT process. Participants will better understand how forensic interviewers are trained, best practices standards for field vs. forensic interviewing, and how to work with child advocacy centers (CACs).



PARTICIPANTS WILL:

- Enhance their knowledge of child development, memory and trauma, disclosure dynamics and the Children's Advocacy Center (CAC) model in Oregon.
- Be able to Identify question types used when talking with children, learn strategies designed to reduce trauma and be more prepared to deploy questions in a legally sound, developmentally-appropriate and defensible manner.
- Understand MDT roles and responsibilities and how to work together to provide collaborative child abuse response throughout the life of a case.
