- Receive help on trauma-informed responding and supporting disclosures.

Session 2: Management-Only Training – 1 PM - 3 PM

- Learn strategies for continuing discussions inside of your organizations for healthy relationships as well as increasing staff comfort with speaking up.
- Continue discussions on environmental safety in organizations and strengthened relationships between staff and youth.
- Learn enhanced techniques for supervision, monitoring, coaching, and documenting.
