Sets a \$50 a day per diem for Board members for Board meetings; deletes requirement that notice of proposed rulemakings be sent to the Associated Press; other minor housekeeping items.

A public rulemaking hearing may be requested in writing by 10 or more people, or by an association with 10 or more members, within 21 days following the publication of the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking in the *Oregon Bulletin* or 28 days from the date Notice was sent to people on the agency mailing list, whichever is later. If sufficient hearing requests are received, the notice of the date and time of the rulemaking hearing must be published in the *Oregon Bulletin* at least 14 days before the hearing.

ORS 183.335(2)(b)(G) requests public comment on whether other options should be considered for achieving the rule's substantive goals while reducing negative economic impact of the rule on business.

Need for the Rule(s):

Increases Board member per diem for purposes of member recruitment and retention. Deletes the requirement that notice of proposed rulemakings be sent to the Associated Press because the Secretary of State Archives Division already mails a copy of the Board's notice to the Associated Press under OAR 166-500-000(3)(a), so therefore the requirement is redundant and a waste of state resources. Also, the revisions correct various errors and grammatical problems to improve readability and promote usage of plain language (these modifications are not substantive).
