RULE SUMMARY

The proposed amendment applies to applicants who possess a doctoral degree from a regionally accredited, provincially chartered, or foreign program and can verify that they enrolled in their program prior to August 12, 2011. The change will allow such applicants to apply the "old rule" definition of one continuous year "in-residence" at the institution from which the degree is granted. This provision will be effective through August 12, 2015.

A public rulemaking hearing may be requested in writing by 10 or more people, or by an association with 10 or more members, within 21 days following the publication of the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking in the Oregon Bulletin or 28 days from the date Notice was sent to people on the agency mailing list, whichever is later. If sufficient hearing requests are received, the notice of the date and time of the rulemaking hearing must be published in the Oregon Bulletin at least 14 days before the hearing.

The Agency requests public comment on whether other options should be considered for achieving the rule's substantive goals while reducing negative

Need for the Rule(s):

The Board determined that current definition of "in-residence" poses difficulties in qualifying for licensure for some clinical psychology applicants possessing doctoral degrees from regionally accredited, provincially chartered, and foreign programs. The Board determined that the rules should provide flexibility to those applicants who enrolled in their program prior to August 12, 2011, when public notice of the former proposed change in the definition of "in-residence" was published.
