Current as of June 26, 2020

a) Licensure

54 new applications have been received and 38 licenses have been issued in 2020. There are currently 188 active applications- including 74 practicing residents. There are 2,135 licensees: 1,681 active, 224 semi-active, 224 inactive, 1 suspended, and 5 on probation.

b) Consumer Protection

34 complaints have been filed in 2020. There are currently 73 open cases (including the investigation files scheduled for Board consideration): 58 licensees, 3 applicants, and 12 unlicensed practice cases. There are 4 contested cases and 2 cases on appeal.
