



Downtown Pendleton Pilot Parklet Program



Parklets are an innovative and cost-effective way to add public gathering space, plantings, and public art in a privately-funded and privately-maintained public space. Parklets are also a method for supporting the downtown business community by creating a more attractive commercial corridor, fostering social engagement, and providing enhancements that contribute to economic vitality and livability.

Parklets are a relatively new concept to many small towns, but they have been successfully implemented in Oregon cities such as Milwaukie, Eugene, Astoria, Newberg, Forest Grove, and the Dalles.





FUNDING

Subject to availability and approval by the Pendleton Development Commission, this project will not exceed \$25,000 per year.

Project are funded on a reimbursement basis. Only funds spent on the purchase of parklet materials will be reimbursed.

The Urban Renewal Agency reserves the right to deny any and all applications and to award no grant funding for parklet construction.

Subject to funding availability, the URA will reimburse up to \$2500 per parklet.

APPLICATIONS

Applicants must develop and submit an application with the required elements to the Pendleton Downtown Association. Applications will be reviewed by the PDA and City Staff on a first-come, first-served basis.

We recommend the use of an architect, engineer, or designer to ensure proper building standards are followed.
