

## City of Stayton Palette of Acceptable Colors

Section 17.20.220.3.g.4 of the Stayton Land Use and Development Code requires that the predominant colors of commercial and mixed use buildings in the Downtown Zones be earth tones, defined as shades of green, red, gray, brown and yellow with a light reflecting value of no less than 15 or no more than 50%. A palette of approved colors is maintained in the Planning Director's office.

The palette contains paint chips of acceptable paint colors. The paint chips are samples of Sherwin Williams and Valspar paints. Paint from other manufacturers of paint is acceptable, but must match the acceptable colors on the palette.

The pallet lists the light reflecting value and for a given hue provides two different samples. These two paint samples are grouped together in the list below. Paint colors with a light reflecting value between the two samples are acceptable as well.

The palette contains the following paint colors, listed by manufacturers' name and color code. SW codes are Sherwin Williams paints. VR codes and codes without letter prefixes are Valspar paints.

The above colors control the predominant colors of a building. Contrasting colors shall be used to accentuate and highlight trim, windows, and other building features and are exempt from the color palette and light reflecting values for the body of the building. The Code requires the Planning Director to approve the combination of colors used for body and trim as consistent with the overall theme desired for the Downtown area.

While no permit is required to repaint a building, building owners and painting contractors are encouraged to contact the Planning and Development Department when selecting a paint color and before repainting. The Color Palettes are available for comparison – bring in the paint chips for the paints you are considering.
