

2022 Oregon Main Street Revitalization Grant Workshop





Grant Purpose

Acquire, rehabilitate, and construct buildings on properties in designated downtown areas statewide; and

Facilitate community revitalization that will lead to private investment, job creation or retention, establishing or expanding viable businesses, or creating a stronger tax base.

Eligibility

Applicant

- Oregon Main StreetNetwork organization
- Capacity to work with project leaders
- Able to receive & expend grant funds & meet fiscal responsibilities

Property

- Within the approved, designated Main Street boundary
- If not the property owner, the Main Street organization must have a signed agreement with the owner

Project Eligibility and Requirements

- Rehabilitation or restoration of properties
- Compatible new construction
- Acquisition of properties planned use must meet the grant requirements



Secretary of the Interior's Standards

The standards must be followed even if the property is not National Register listed.

Character defining features





Financial Information

- Reimbursement grant
- Award up to \$200,000
- Match of 30% of award amount required, so for a \$200,000, \$60,000 match is required.
- Grant funded work and match must occur within the grant period
- 10% is withheld until complete, match met

Grant Process

- Grant deadline March 15
- Technical review
- Selection
- Notification goal May 12, 2022
- Agreement & Start TBA
- Reporting
 - Progress reports, final report, 1 year report
