



Statewide Funding Opportunities

Tips for Success with Grant Applications

- Decide if your need is aligned with the grant program priorities
- Know who you are and what you are planning to do
- Reach out to the program officer with questions
- Demonstrate that people with lived experience are meaningfully leading and/or influencing the work





Community Grants Program

- Two Grant Cycles in 2023:
 - Spring Cycle: general operating
 - Fall Cycle: organizational enhancement
- Community review process, based in the OCF regions shared earlier
- Program prioritizes funding for nonprofits meetings most pressing need of communities in Oregon.

Rural-Based Organization?

An organization is rural-based if:

An organization that focuses on a community with a population of 35,000 or fewer that is NOT directly adjacent to (or part of a) metropolitan area of 50,000 or more.

Organizations

- Culturally specific (any operating budget
- Rural/emerging organizations (operating budget of \$250,000 or less)

Awards

• Up to \$40,000 \$5,000-\$30,000
