GOT MAIL?

Keep your email and mailing address current with OSBAE to receive renewal information, updates on rule changes, newsletters, and more. Individuals can <u>update their contact information online</u> and firms may complete and submit a <u>Contact Information Change Form</u>.

Not only will you receive important updates, you'll also be following the rules! State rules require that you **notify us of any changes within 60 days**, so keep that information current!

REGISTRATION RENEWAL INFORMATION INDIVIDUALS (ARI)

The renewal deadline for an architect certificate of registration ending in an odd-number is December 31 of odd-numbered years. The renewal deadline for an architect certificate of registration ending in an even-number is December 31 of even-numbered years.

If your ARI ends in an ODD number, then your registration expires December 31, 2023.

A registration renewal is considered late if the registrant has not completed the requirements for renewal by December 31, 2023.

Continuing education is considered late if the registrant has not completed the continuing education requirements specified under OAR 806-010-0145 by December 31, 2023.

To renew an architect certificate of registration, the registrant must:

- Complete renewal information online and certify that the requirements for continuing education under OAR 806-010-0145 have been met; and
- · Pay all required renewal fees, including any applicable late fees
 - two-year renewal fee \$240
 - o late renewal fee \$150 (if renewed after December 31)
 - o late CE fee \$240 (CE completed after December 31)

If not renewed, the certificate of registration is inactive on March 1, 2024, and the individual architect may not practice architecture in Oregon.

Renewal season opens for Individuals November 8, 2023.

An email will be sent on opening day to the email address on record. The email will contain all the information, including a PIN, necessary to log in to the Online Renewal System and complete your renewal. You may also go to our website (see Registrants – Renewal) after November 8 to request a renewal PIN.

Note: a new PIN is issued with each renewal, a previous PIN will not be valid.

PREPARE NOW!

- Update your contact information online when it changes to ensure receipt of renewal emails. To check and/or change it go to <u>Oregon.gov/osbae</u>, Registrants, <u>Update Contact Information</u>, and enter the requested information to log in.
- ♦ Mark your calendar for November 9. If your registration is up for renewal and you did not receive an email from architectboard@osbae.oregon.gov check your junk mail.



REGISTRATION RENEWAL INFORMATION FIRMS (ARF)

The renewal deadline for an architectural firm's certificate of registration is January 31 of each year.

A firm's registration renewal is considered late if the registrant has not completed the requirements for renewal by January 31.

To renew an architectural firm's certificate of registration, the architectural firm representative must:

- Complete renewal information online; and
- Pay the architectural firm renewal fee including any applicable late fees
 - o one-year renewal fee \$200
 - o late renewal fee \$150 (if renewed after January 31)

If not renewed, the certificate of registration is inactive on April 1, 2024, and the architectural firm may not provide architectural services in Oregon.

Renewal season opens for Firms December 13, 2023.

An email will be sent on opening day to the email address on record. The email will contain all the information, including a PIN, necessary to log in to the Online Renewal System and complete your renewal. You may also go to our website after December 13 to request a renewal PIN.

Note: a new PIN is issued with each renewal, a previous PIN will not be valid.

PREPARE NOW!

- Update your contact information when it changes to ensure receipt of renewal emails. Go to <u>Oregon.gov/osbae</u>, Registrants, <u>Update Contact Information</u>, then complete and submit a Contact Information Change Form. This form must be signed by the firm representative.
- Mark your calendar for December 14. If your registration is up for renewal and you did not receive an email from <u>architectboard@osbae.oregon.gov</u> check your junk mail.



HOW TO SURVIVE A CONTINUING EDUCATION (CE) AUDIT

Review and understand <u>OAR 806-010-0145 Continuing Education</u> and <u>OAR 806-010-0090 Renewal of Registration.</u>

Complete **24 HEALTH**, **SAFETY**, **AND WELFARE** (**HSW**) hours of CE before your current registration expires. CE may **not** be rolled over from one registration period to another.

ARI registrations that end in an odd-number expire December 31 of odd-numbered years (12/31/2023). ARI registrations that end in an even-number expire December 31 of even-numbered years (12/31/2024).

Get your CE records in order before renewing your registration.

Obtain a certificate of completion for each course or if you are an AIA member, ensure every course appears on your AIA transcript.

Check each certificate or transcript for "HSW."

CAREFULLY READ AND UNDERSTAND the CE questions when completing your renewal and pay attention to the dates; contact us if you have any questions! **BE HONEST** when answering the CE questions; untruthfulness may result in disciplinary action, such as a civil penalty!

RETAIN the following records:

Certificates of completion that include the minimum required information per <u>OAR 806-010-0145(6)(a).</u>

AIA transcript in lieu of certificates of completion.

Note, the following types of records are **NOT** acceptable proof of CE completion:

Personal logs or spreadsheets

Proofs of course registration

Course descriptions

Below are the questions you'll be asked when you renew your registration. Be sure to **ANSWER BOTH QUESTIONS CORRECTLY!**

- As outlined in OAR 806-010-0145, I confirm I will complete a minimum of 24 hours of continuing education in health, safety, and welfare between January 1, 2022 and DECEMBER 31, 2023; or I confirm this is my first renewal with OSBAE.
- As outlined in OAR 806-010-0145, I confirm I will complete a minimum of 24 hours of continuing education in health, safety, and welfare between January 1, 2022 and FEBRUARY 29, 2024 and will pay the late continuing education fee with this renewal.

If you experience a medical hardship that prevents you from completing 24 HSW hours, notify the Board immediately and be prepared to provide a letter certified by a medical doctor, or other information requested by the Board.

REVISED STATUTES & ADMINISTRATIVE RULES

EFFECTIVE JANUARY 2, 2024

The Oregon Legislature passed Senate Bill (SB) 224 during the 2023 legislative session, and it was signed into law by Governor Kotek on May 8, 2023. Administrative rulemaking to implement SB 224 was approved by the Oregon State Board of Architect Examiners at their August 11, 2023 meeting. The revisions to the Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) and Oregon Administrative Rules (OAR) take effect on January 2, 2024.

SB 224 updated terminology and described concepts related to architectural practice in a way that is more consistent with architectural practice across the country. Modifications to definitions were influenced by the National Council of Architectural Registration Board's Model Law, and by statutes that govern architecture in other jurisdictions.

Links to SB 224 and the rulemaking are available on our website under <u>Resources – Statutes and Rules</u>. Listed below are some key revisions from SB 224 and the associated administrative rules.

- Updated definitions, such as:
 - "Practice of architecture" means engaging in the art and science of designing, in whole or in part, buildings and the space within and appurtenant to buildings and providing related services that include, but are not limited to, planning, developing design concepts, preparing technical submissions and other documents that define a building's form and function, coordinating construction work and the work of other consultants and providing construction phase services.
 - "Responsible control" means a degree of control over an operation that is consistent with the scope of a registered architect's professional knowledge and the application of a registered architect's professional standard of care.
 - "Responsible control" as defined in ORS 671.010 includes but is not limited to an architect's integration of information from manufacturers, suppliers, installers, the architect's consultants, owners, contractors, or other sources the architect reasonably relies upon consistent with the required professional standard of care, that is incidental to and intended to be incorporated into the architect's technical submissions if the architect has coordinated and reviewed such information.
 - "Technical submission" means a plan, design, drawing, blueprint or other document that an architect prepares in connection with the practice of architecture and submits to a regulatory authority to comply with the state building code, a municipal building code or related rules, ordinances, resolutions or other regulatory requirements.
- Removed confusion regarding plan stamping by other design professionals; stamping requirements were simplified to state technical submissions must be stamped by a registered architect and the stamp constitutes certification that the architect was in responsible control of the content.
- Specified how long project documentation should be retained (not less than 10 years following completion of the project).

REVISED STATUTES & ADMINISTRATIVE RULES continued . . .

- Reduced barriers to architectural firm registration by changing ownership and firm name requirements.
 - An architectural firm's board of directors or ownership is no longer required to be made up of at least two-thirds architects and engineers and one-third architects registered to practice. Instead of a board or ownership composition requirement, (1) architectural services provided by a firm must be under the responsible control of Oregon registered architects that are owners or employees of the firm and (2) all technical submissions required to bear the stamp of an architect must bear the stamp of the Oregon registered architect in responsible control of the preparation of the documents. In addition, the revisions deleted the requirement that firm names identify the firm as being engaged in the provision of architectural services.
- Allows firms located outside of Oregon or not registered in Oregon to offer to provide architectural services in Oregon so long as they notify the client that the firm is not registered in Oregon, and so long as the firm registers to practice in Oregon prior to providing services.
- Streamlined the registration renewal process; established one 60-day late registration renewal grace period rather than two 30-day grace periods; a late fee is added if the registration is not renewed by the initial renewal deadline.
- Altered the term dates of board members and removed the five-year residency requirement.
