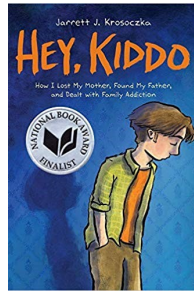


**I Want to Eat Your Pancreas**

**Paper Girls, Volume 5 by Brian K. Vaughan, Cliff Chiang, & Matthew Wilson**

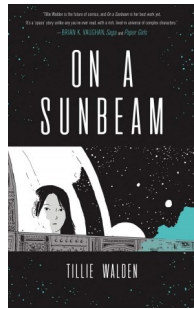

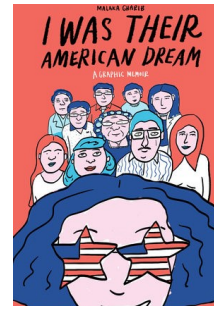
**Crush by Svetlana Chmakova**

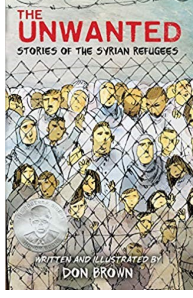
**My Brother's Husband, Volume 2 by Gengoroh Tagame, Anne Ishii**
