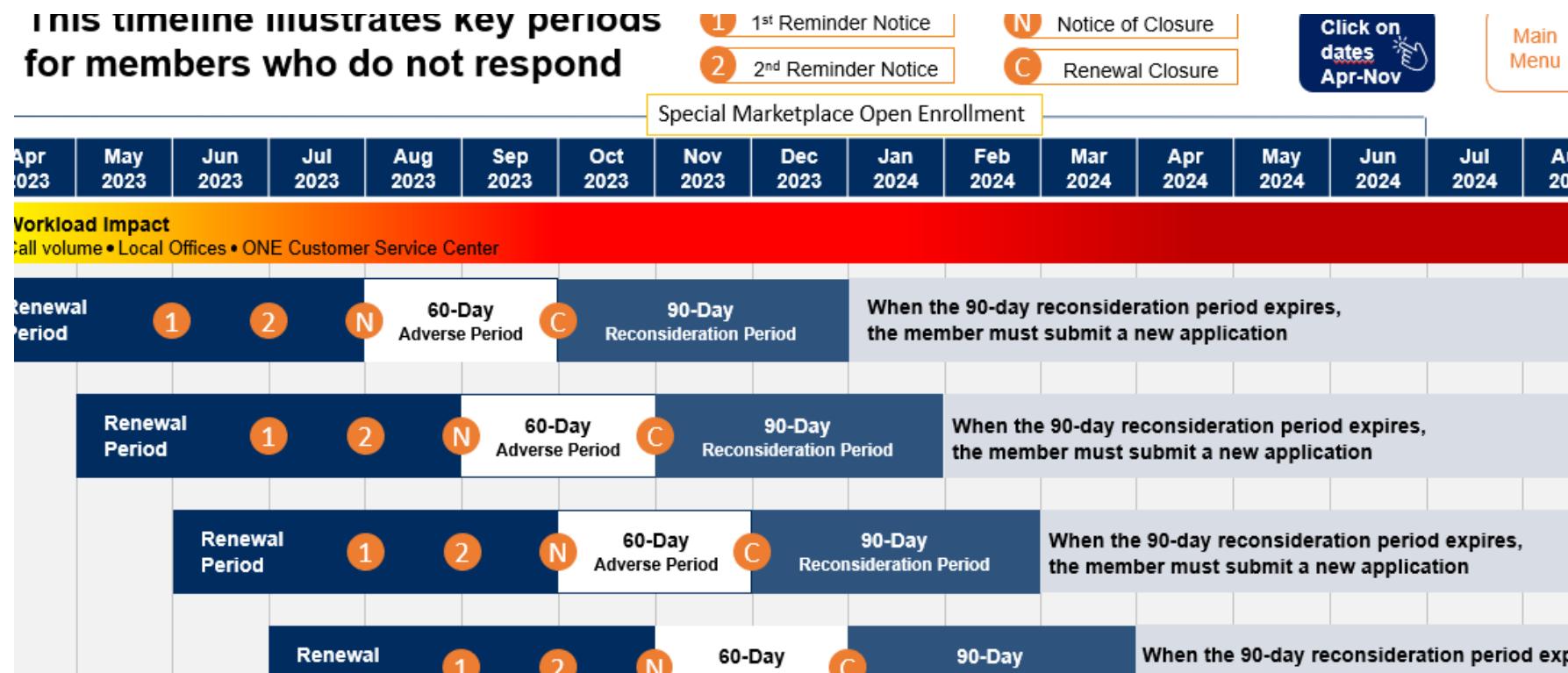

On Wednesday March 1st, the Oregon Health Authority and Oregon Department of Human Services submitted the report "Unwinding the Federal Public Health Emergency HB 4035 Report" to the Oregon Legislative Assembly. State Report on Plans for Prioritizing and Distributing Renewals Following the End of the Medicaid Continuous Enrollment Provisions

Oregon submitted its plan to the Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services on initiating medical renewals, including how renewals will be distributed, and process and strategies the state is considering or has adopted to mitigate against inappropriate coverage loss during the unwinding period. 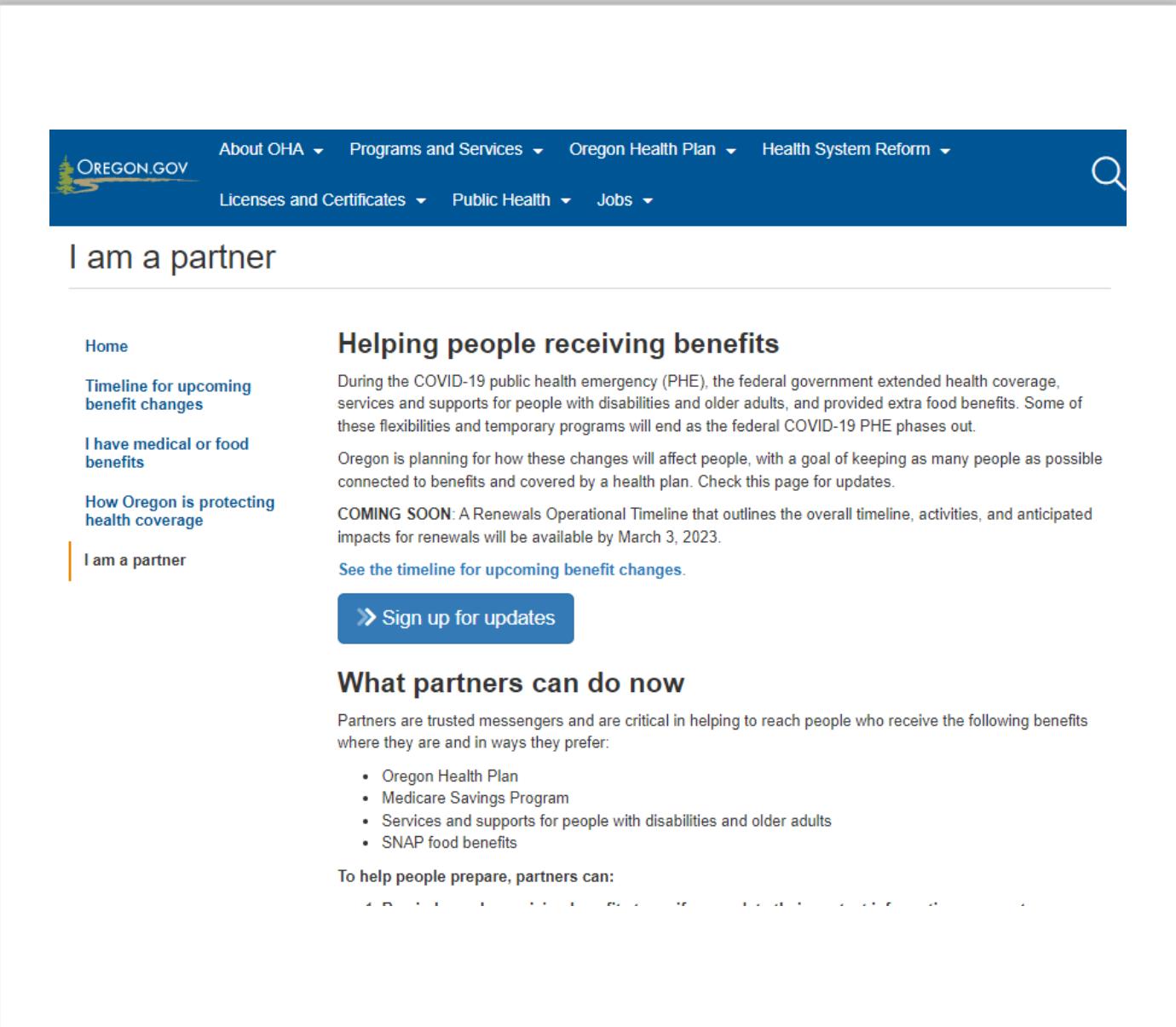
