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## Proven CPS techniques enhance learning

Destination ImagiNation® -the largest world-wide creative problem solving program-has proven to be one of the most successful programs to supplement a rigorous educational curriculum for students in kindergarten through 12<sup>th</sup> grade. Destination ImagiNation® (also known as DI) partnered with Dr. Don Treffinger and the *Center for Creative Learning* to develop the methods and processes that are the foundation of DI. Teams of educators from around the country use proven Creative Problem Solving (CPS) techniques to enhance the learning experience for kids, while emphasizing FUN!

**If you are looking for an enrichment program for your students, Destination ImagiNation®** offers a high quality creative problem solving program for students across the state. Oregon DI provides training, activities, support for team managers, and tournaments throughout Oregon to support the hundreds of students who form teams to do DI each year.

Beginning in the fall and working toward Regional Tournament in late February or early March, students in Destination ImagiNation® use what they have learned in the classroom to work together in teams of up to 7 students to solve one of five central challenges. The focus of each challenge varies, emphasizing dramatic and artistic skills, or technical and mechanical skills in varying degrees. Throughout the year the teams also practice improvisational Instant Challenges that stimulate the team's ability to think quickly and creatively. Most teams in Oregon are facilitated by parent managers. Through this program students learn brainstorming and creative thinking skills, project and time management, and presentation skills, while having a great time. **PROJECT OUTREACH**, a sixth challenge for middle and high school students involves community service. And for younger students (k-2), the **RIISING STARS** challenge teaches all the DI concepts in a non-competitive environment.
