Get a Taste of Campus Life

SEP participants live in UO dormitories. Living groups are divided by age and gender with a counselor and junior counselor residing with each group. In a carefully supervised setting, we

create a tight-knit community where students from ages 12-18 feel comfortable, safe, and connected. A student to staff ratio of approximately 10 to 1 allows us to address the specific needs of each age group and each individual. Balancing structure and choice in age-appropriate ways, students spend their time after classes relaxing with friends, shopping in local campus stores or participating in outdoor activities. Evenings and weekends provide more choices: a creative problem solving competition, movie night, a trip to the local Saturday Market, a Halloween dance and more!

Challenge Yourself

Students have the opportunity to choose six academic classes from over 20 courses offered. Subjects typically include: science, mathematics, literature, languages, writing, visual arts, dance, theatre, music, law, cultural studies, history, engineering and technology. All classes are held in university classrooms, studio spaces and labs. SEP instructors are Master's and Ph.D. degree candidates, licensed teachers and professors who share their expertise and passion for learning. Course descriptions for 2012 will be posted on our website as they become finalized in May.

Is SEP Right For You?

Students must be in grades 6–10 during the 2011–12 school year or at an equivalent home school level and should demonstrate two or more of the following characteristics:

- ☐ Achievement at least two grades higher than present grade level
- ☐ Measured intelligence above average
- ☐ Unusual creative or productive thinking ability
- ☐ A special talent
- ☐ Proven leadership ability
- ☐ Exceptional ability in the visual or performing arts





PROGRAM COSTS

The cost per session is \$1545 plus a \$50 non-refundable application fee. This provides for six academic courses and materials, dormitory housing, three meals a day, recreation and social events, and 24-hour supervision for the two-week session. Additional spending money for photos, shirts and personal use is recommended. Courtesy shuttle service to/from the Eugene airport is available.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

The UO Summer Enrichment Program is a self-supporting program, with all costs met through student tuition and private donations. A limited number of need-based scholarships are available. INTERNATIONAL PARTNERSHIPS

For the past three years, SEP has been honored to partner with Kyungnam University in South Korea. The participation of these students in the program has enabled a meaningful cultural exchange and the formation of long distance as well as long lasting friendships. In 2012 we are looking forward to possibility of again hosting students from Kyungnam as well as forming new international associations. JUNIOR COUNSELOR LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

If you are an older student interested in developing leadership skills, and earning up to 130 community service hours, we provide an opportunity to participate in SEP as a Junior Counselor. During morning class, JC's learn leadership tools that help enhance self confidence, motivation, verbal communications, creative problem solving, and conflict resolution skills. JC's also will get support and a head start with resume writing, interviewing, and applying to colleges – including essay writing, time management and creating budgets.

To be eligible, students must be under 18 and in grades 11 or 12 during the 2011–2012 school year. The cost for participating in the Junior Counselor program is \$1180. Applications must be received by May 1 for priority consideration.



HOW TO APPLY

New Applicants

- 1. Complete Part A of the application.
- 2. Obtain a copy of your most recent grade report from your school.
- 3. Have a teacher, counselor, or school administrator complete Part B.
- 4. Mail these materials with the \$50 non-refundable application fee.

Returning Applicants

- 1. Complete Part A of the application.
- 2. Obtain a copy of your most recent grade report from your school.
- 3. Mail these materials with the \$50 non-refundable application fee.

Junior Counselor Applicants

- 1. Complete Part A of the application. Exclude Roommate Request
- 2. Obtain a copy of your most recent grade report from your school.
- 3. Include two letters of recommendation.
- 4. Mail these materials by May 1.

Applications for SEP, grades 6-10, must be received by May 15 for priority consideration. Students will receive a confirmation email upon acceptance to SEP. Instructions for registering online, and a 2012 course list will be emailed, or mailed if needed, to accepted applicants in late May. Class registration occurs on the first day of the program. Incomplete applications cannot be processed.
