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Dr. Alverson is Professor Emeritus and Regents' Professor at the University of New Mexico where he is the Medical Director of the Center for Telehealth and Cybermedicine Research involved in the planning, implementation, research and evaluation of Telemedicine systems for New Mexico, nationally and internationally. He is also the Chief Medical Informatics Officer at LCF Research assisting in their efforts to address the development and meaningful use of health information exchange, adoption of electronic health records, and integration with telemedicine. He is a Past President of the American Telemedicine Association and involved in several collaborative international Telehealth projects to advance Telehealth and HIT globally.

Dr. Carroll is the medical director for population health innovation at the Flagstaff Medical Center/Northern Arizona Healthcare. In this role, he supports population health management service development in northern Arizona through value-based health system innovation, emerging technology and care processes, and inter-organizational collaboration. Between 1992 and 2012, he served Native American health care in multiple capacities at the local, regional, and national level. His roles in Indian health included those of hospital CMO and CIO, regional program director and informatics consultant, and national telehealth program director for the Indian Health Service. Mark is a former board member of the American Telemedicine Association.
