Meet Stepha!

During the 2022 Oregon Legislative Session HB 4092 was passed to better enable the newly created Oregon Broadband Office to successfully prepare for and manage the federal broadband funding designated for Oregon. Included in that bill was a restructuring of the Oregon Broadband Advisory Council. The Council is made up of 13 members whose mission is to encourage coordination and collaboration between organizations and economic sectors to leverage the development and utilization of broadband for education, workforce development, and telehealth. Telehealth was not originally represented, but TAO fought hard during the session to make sure it was included. Steph Dragoon emerged as the ideal candidate to fill the position and was approved by the Governor. She is working diligently to represent telehealth at the Council table.

COVID PHE Extended

The federal government will extend the COVID-19 public health emergency declaration until at least April. HHS had officially extended the PHE until January 13, 2023. Lacking the 60-day notice before the end of the PHE HHS promised to give providers, the PHE will likely not end until April. The is important because the PHE keeps the waivers regarding telehealth coverage in place until 151 days after the end of the PHE. The extension will allow Congress and CMS to continue considering how to best manage the provisions in the waivers – whether to extend them permanently, let them expire, ore modify the waivers based on data gathered during the PHE. There are many pieces of telehealth legislation pending in Congress. No single bill will likely pass. A more like scenario is that the provisions in some of the bills that were introduced will be included in a larger bill such as a budget/funding package.

(she always said she was just someone living with pancreatic cancer) behind on her way to her next adventure. Susie's bright smile and ready wit made her a welcome asset as we struggled to grow Oregon's telehealth programs. She was an advocate, a mediator and a friend.
